

25th May – Clayfield Copse

We were using a Neolithic path building technique as a trial for resurfacing part of the bridlepath through Clayfield Copse. This involves laying down large bundles of birch twigs to form a springy base on which a thick layer of woodchip can be placed. Hopefully this will stop this section of the path becoming a muddy quagmire like some of the other sections have done during the winter.
